Meyer Takes Oath of Office as Fairfield County Clerk of Courts

After receiving his commission yesterday from Governor John Kasich, Branden C. Meyer was sworn in as the next Fairfield County Clerk of Courts during a private ceremony in the Hall of Justice, by Judge Terre Vandervoort. A public swearing in ceremony will be held on Thursday, February 6 at 1:00 p.m. in the Commissioners' Hearing Room located at 210 E. Main Street in Lancaster.

Meyer has served in a number of political posts since graduating from Capital University in 2004 with a Bachelor's of Arts degree in history, political science and German. He was formerly the southeast regional director for Congressman Steve Stivers. Before that, he served as the Fairfield County clerk/manager, worked for Congressman Dave Hobson, Congressman Steve Austria and served as an assistant clerk with the Court of Claims of Ohio.

The County Clerk of Courts is responsible for filing, docketing, indexing, and preserving court pleadings for civil, felony, criminal and domestic relations cases. The Clerk of Courts also processes appeals from all lower courts within the county. Further, the Title Division of the Clerk of the Courts processes automobile and watercraft titles by linking to the State of Ohio through by a sophisticated computer network.

"This office needs someone who will give the hard working staff the leadership and support that they need to do their jobs. I have spent many years in public service and understand the importance of the need for transparency and honesty in order to gain and keep the trust of the public. I have always treated people with respect and dignity and I am looking forward to this opportunity," Meyer said.
